### PETROLEUM PRODUCTS AND ENERGY ACT, 1990: APPLICATION OF CERTAIN SPECIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS UNDER THE PETROLEUM PRODUCTS REGULATIONS

Under regulation 44 of the Petroleum Products Regulations promulgated under Government Notice No. 155 of 23 June 2000, I apply to retail licence-holders, wholesale licence-holders and certificate-holders, with effect from the date of publication of this notice -

- (a) the code of practice mentioned in Part A of the Table set out below in relation to the design, construction and maintenance of electrical equipment used in connection with any petroleum products;
- (b) the code of practice mentioned in Part B of the Table set out below, in relation to the storage, distribution and handling of petroleum products and the installation of storage tanks and other structures, pipework, pumps and plant used in connection with petroleum products;
- (c) the specifications and standards mentioned in Part C of the Table set out below in relation to the composition of petroleum products imported into or distributed in Namibia by any wholesaler, or sold at a retail outlet.
