**ASSIGNMENT OF ADMINISTRATION OF CERTAIN LAWS TO THE MINISTER
OF AGRICULTURE, WATER AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT**

Under the powers vested in me by section 3(1)(a) of the Assignment of Powers Act, 1990 (Act No. 4 of 1990), I hereby assign to the Minister of Agriculture, Water and Rural Development the administration of the provisions of the laws referred to in the Schedule, including any regulations made thereunder, in so far as the powers, duties and functions conferred or imposed by those laws vest in me by virtue of the provisions of Article 140 of the Namibian Constitution, but excluding any provision of any such law conferring -

- (a) a power which is required to be exercised by proclamation in the *Gazette*;
- (b) a power to enter into international agreements.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE FEE PAYABLE FOR REGISTRATION TO THE OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY BOARD MADE UNDER THE ALLIED HEALTH SERVICES PROFESSIONS ACT, 1993

The Minister of Health and Social Services, on the recommendation of the Occupational Therapy Board, has under section 45 of the Allied Health Services Professions Act, 1993 (Act No. 20 of 1993), made the regulations set out in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

1. In these regulations, "the Act" means the Allied Health Services Professions Act, 1993 (Act No. 20 of 1993) and, unless the context otherwise indicates, an expression defined in that Act, has a corresponding meaning; and

"Board" means the Occupational Therapy Board established the Act.

Fee payable for registration

2. The fee payable to the Board by a person in respect of registration as an occupational therapist under section 13 of the Act or conditional registration under section 19 of the Act is N\$100.00

QUALIFICATIONS PRESCRIBED FOR REGISTRATION WITH THE CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY BOARD: ALLIED HEALTH SERVICES PROFESSIONS ACT, 1993 (ACT NO. 20 OF 1993)

The Minister of Health and Social Services has under section 18 of the Allied Health Services Professions Act, 1993 (Act No. 20 of 1993), and on the recommendation of the Clinical Psychology Board, prescribed that a Masters Degree in Psychology or an equivalent thereof, obtained by virtue of examinations conducted by an educational institution set forth in the Schedule below, entitles the holder of such a Masters Degree or equivalent thereof to registration under the Act, with the Clinical Psychology Board, if the holder thereof has -

- (a) successfully completed a period of at least two thousand hours practical training as an intern-clinical psychologist under the supervision of a clinical psychologist approved by that Board; and
- (b) has complied with any other requirement prescribed by or under that Act.
