Additional Appropriation Act 25 of 1996

came into force on date of publication: 30 December 1996

ACT

To appropriate amounts of money to meet the financial requirements of the State during the financial year ending 31 March 1997.

(Signed by the President on 21 December 1996)

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of the Republic of Namibia, as follows:-

Appropriation of amounts of money for financial requirements of the State

1. Subject to the provisions of the State Finance Act, 1991 (Act 31 of 1991), there are hereby appropriated for the financial requirements of the State during the financial year ending 31 March 1997, as a charge to the State Revenue Fund, the additional amounts of money shown in the Schedule.

Short title

2. This Act shall be called the Additional Appropriation Act, 1996.
