Appropriation Act 16 of 1998

(GG 1893)

came into force on date of publication: 22 June 1998

ACT

To appropriate amounts of money to meet the financial requirements of the State during the financial year ending 31 March 1999.

(Signed by the President on 11 June 1998)

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of the Republic of Namibia, as follows:-

Appropriation of amounts of money for financial requirements of the State

1. Subject to the provisions of the State Finance Act, 1991 (Act No. 31 of 1991), there are hereby appropriated for the financial requirements of the State during the financial year ending 31 March 1999, as a charge to the State Revenue Fund, the amounts of money shown in the Schedule.

Short title

2. This Act shall be called the Appropriation Act, 1998.
