Payment of Bank Notes Proclamation 3 of 1933

PROCLAMATION

BY HIS HONOUR ALBERTUS JOHANNES WERTH,
ADMINISTRATOR OF SOUTH WEST AFRICA

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

[The provisions in this Proclamation have no headings.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision in respect of the payment of bank-notes issued under the provisions of the Banks Proclamation, 1930;

NOW THEREFORE, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby proclaim, declare and make known as follows:

1. (1) The holder of a bank-note issued under the provisions of the Banks Proclamation, 1930 (Proclamation No. 29 of 1930), shall not be entitled to the payment of such note in gold.

(2) A bank shall not, for the purposes of section *twenty-six* of the said Proclamation, be deemed not to pay its notes in full on failing to pay such notes in gold.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Payment of Bank-notes Proclamation, 1933, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 28th December, 1932.
