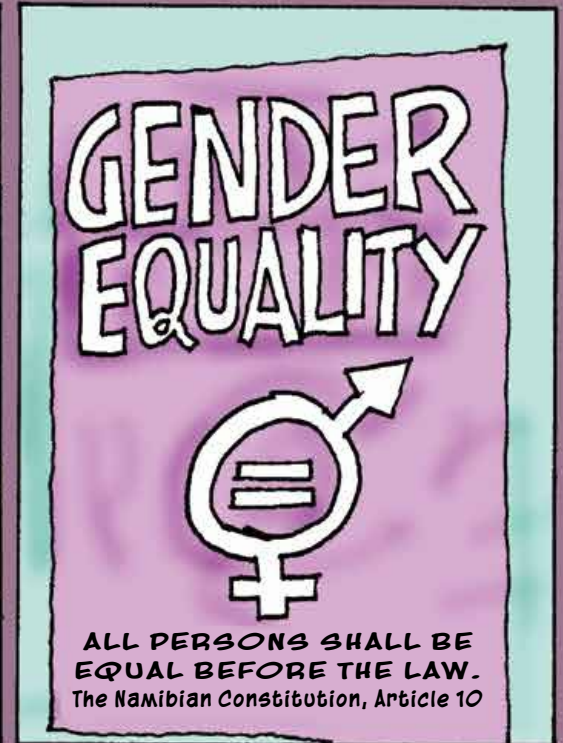


# WHAT DOES GENDER EQUALITY MEAN IN A RELATIONSHIP?

BACK AT HOME ...



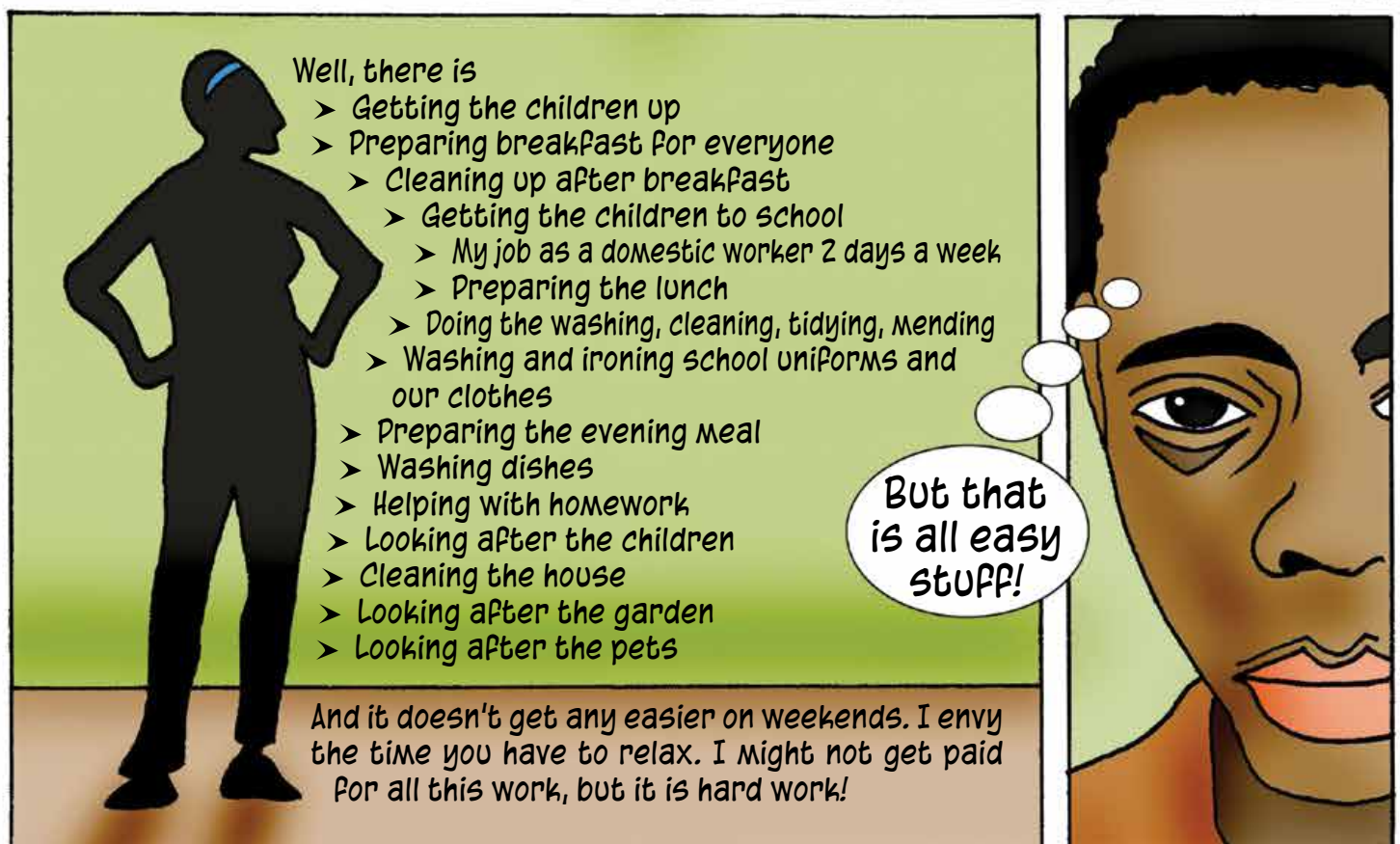
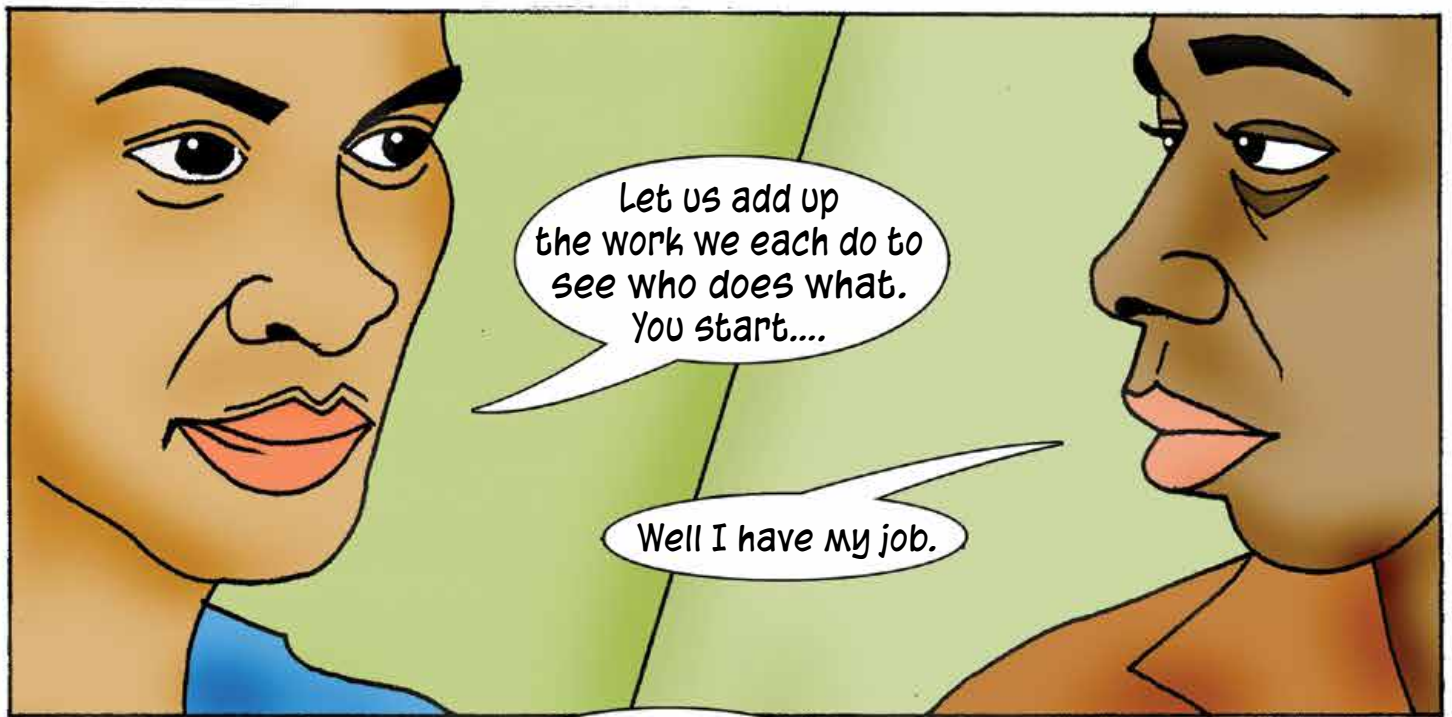
Look at this. A community group in our town gave me this poster.

I have always thought cooking looks interesting. So many of the great chefs in the world are men. If you could help me at first, I could even give that a try. I might end up being brilliant at it!




What are you doing? Men don't cook!

This one does. Cooking does not make me less of a man, it makes me a better man because I can look after my family in every way. And it gives my wife a rest, she works very hard. I will set you a challenge my friend - swap roles with your wife for just one day. Then come back and tell me how you found it.

Our life is so much better now that we work as a team and treat each other as equals.

It seems the more I help out at home, the more love and respect I get from you.



There is no such thing as "men's work" and "women's work". Everyone in the household should share the household chores fairly.

Where there is mutual respect and co-operation in a relationship, gender-based violence is less likely.

Women often do double work – wage-earning work plus the lion's share of the household tasks and child-care. That is just not fair! Parents have equal rights and responsibilities when it comes to their children, so they should share the daily work equally as well.

Real men do not feel threatened by doing cooking, cleaning or child care! The law no longer recognises anyone as being the "head of the household".

Paid work outside the home and unpaid work in the home both take up lots of time, effort and energy. Both kinds of work contribute to the family and are equally important.



I am terrible at fixing things around the house but my wife is really good with her hands. So she fixes things and I look after the children more.

My wife is doing an evening course. It will help her to earn more money in the future. While she is at classes I care for the children. I like being able to spend more time with my children, I have a better relationship with them now.

I swapped roles with my wife for one day. I always thought that I did all the work in the family. Now I know that she works really hard too. Now we share the household tasks more evenly.

A man should be proud of his wife if she can earn a good salary. If a man only feels valued because of what he earns, things like love and respect are missing from the marriage.

If the workload in your family is uneven, are there any changes that you could make?

My husband offered to do the cooking in our home. It turns out that he is a terrible cook. Now I am doing the cooking again. I am happy with this arrangement because I am doing something that I am good at and not just because I am a woman.

I am looking forward to a future where all men and women are equal. It will be a better place for us all.
