
HOW TO CLAIM CHILD MAINTENANCE



This cartoon has been produced to explain how a woman can claim maintenance payments from the father of her child. The cartoon is based on the Maintenance Act 9 of 2003. The cartoon explains the law using the example of Lukas, a 4 year old child and his parents Maria and Simon.

An application for child maintenance consists of 3 main steps. Either parent can apply for maintenance if the other does not help support their child.

- 1. You must go to the Magistrate's Court to make a request for maintenance.
- 2. The maintenance officer will meet with the parents to discuss the maintenance.
- 3. If an agreement cannot be made, the case will go before a magistrate.

Glossary

Maintenance Money or goods that a person has a legal duty to provide for the support of his or her dependants. Maintenance is usually paid for basic living expenses such as rent, food, clothing, medicine and school fees.

Dependant Someone who depends upon the support of another person to live. Children are dependants of their parents.

Complainant The person who applies for the maintenence order.

Defendant The person who is asked to pay the maintenance order.

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
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

MAGISTRATE'S COURT



TO REQUEST MAINTENANCE, YOU MUST ANSWER SOME SIMPLE QUESTIONS AND YOU MUST EXPLAIN WHY THE PERSON YOU ARE ASKING TO PAY MAINTENANCE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CHILD.



No but it is helpful if you can show us receipts for things like rent, municipal accounts and school fees.

REMEMBER, IF YOU OR THE FATHER DOES NOT TELL THE TRUTH, THE PUNISHMENT COULD BE A FINE UP TO N\$4000 OR UP TO 12 MONTHS IN PRISON.
