WHAT TO DO IF SOMEONE STOPS PAYING MAINTENANCE











MAINTENANCE OFFICER

You must make a statement saying how much money has not been paid. You should also give me any information about John's property or his work that might help the Magistrate decide what to do. For example, is John working? Do you know if John owns anything valuable?

I don't know anything about his property, but I do know that he is still working at the same job as before. I also heard that since last year, he has made 3 different women pregnant!





That just means he must pay maintenance for all the children. He must use the money he earns to pay maintenance for his children before spending any money on luxuries for himself. How much money has not been paid?







There are a number of different ways to get the money from a person who has stopped paying maintenance. Together we will decide what is best in this situation and we will make a statement to give to the Magistrate.



We don't need John's consent for any of these steps, although he can come to court to ask for a different method of enforcement if he wants. He can also ask for a change in the maintenance order itself if his situation has changed since the court made the order.







It is clear that John is not trustworthy about paying maintenance. The money must be taken directly from his salary. The clerk of the court will send a notice to his employer within 7 days saying that part of John's salary must be sent straight to the child's mother.



















MEN, TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR YOUR CHILDREN!



MAINTENANCE is money or goods that a person has a legal duty to provide for the support of his or her children or other dependants. Maintenance is usually paid for basic living expenses such as rent, food, clothing, medicine and school fees.

This comic has been produced to explain what to do if a person who should be paying maintenance under an order from the maintenance court stops making the payments. The comic explains the law using the example of Sam and his parents, Sarah and John.

DEPENDANT: Someone who depends upon the support of another person to live. Children are dependants of their parents.

COMPLAINANT: The person who applies for the maintenance order.

DEFENDANT: The person who is asked to pay the maintenance order.
