


Slide 1: An ecosystem comprising of various animals and a happy girl named lyaloo standing and looking on. lyaloo: "Hi, my name is lyaloo, and this is my community".

Slide 2: At home, Iyaloo overhead the mom talking on the phone. Mom: "The pangolin scales will be shipped to you tomorrow, everything is in order. Mom: "Just transfer the N\$ 500 000 to my bank account." [Iyaloo behind the door overhearing the mom on the call]

Slide 3: Iyaloo: "Mommy you are always on the phone talking about Pangolin scales" Mom: "I'm so sorry my darling, it's just business" Mia: "Okay mommy, I just wanted to spend some time together". Mom: "Not today, maybe another time, darling". **[Iyaloo and her mom having a conversation]**

Slide 4: Iyaloo: "Okay mommy, Next time. Bye!" Mom: "Bye darling". Iyaloo: Thinking "Mommy is always busy, she doesn't have time for me, this is becoming worrisome" [I with a thinking or worried face]

Slide 5: TV headlines with Pangolins smuggled. [Big screen TV with NBC logo on the corner]

Slide 6: At school. Iyaloo: "Hi Alazinia, I'm on my way to the environmental club meeting too, would you like to walk with me?" Alazinia: "of course Iyaloo, let's go together..." [Iyaloo and Alazinia walking on grass]

Slide 7: [learners seated in the classroom with the chalkboard filled with 'Pangolin smuggling headlines]

Slide 8: Teacher: "Lets us report all the illegal activities that are committed towards our wildlife to the nearest police. This way we are protecting and promoting a healthy ecosystem..." "Our wildlife plays an important role in maintaining a healthy ecosystem and communities can generate money through wildlife conservation as more and more tourists will visit our community. Our people can benefit through job creation in the tourism

industry. "Pangolins help to eat the termites that infest the wood plants." [Class with teacher and learners and a chalkboard]

Slide 9: Iyaloo at home: [TV, news of pangolin smuggling] Iyaloo: Thinking "This topic of Pangolins is very sensitive...the poor animals are being taken away from the natural habitat and very soon they will become extinct..." [Iyaloo seated watching TV]

Slide 10: Iyaloo saw her mom and an unknown man giving her a 5kg white sack. Iyaloo thinking: [Could this be Pangolin scales that I heard mom talking about on the phone the other day? I'll check where she will put it] [Iyaloo looking through the window]

Slide 11: [Iyaloo shocked' she discovered the Pangolin scales in the same 50kg sack.]

Slide 13: [Iyaloo in tears] "OH NOOOOO, Mommy is doing something illegal, let me call my friend Alazinia"

Slide 14: [Iyaloo on The phone] "Hi Alazinia, I'm so disappointed in my mom, I found out that she is involved in some illegal business of selling Pangolins to some foreigners...I don't know what to do? Alazinia [shocked] really? Oh noo... we will talk later Iyaloo"

Slide 15: [Alazinia running towards a police station [building with Police station]

Slide 16: [Police officer facing lyaloo's mother as she opened the door]

Slide 17: Good afternoon Ms John, my name is Inspector James we are doing a random search to look for illegal objects...your rights are protected... [serious face of Inspector James]

Slide 18: [Mother busted with a 5kg of Pangolin scales] Police officer: "Ms John, you are in possession of protected wildlife products under the environmental act number Act 71 of 1962, you are under arrest" lyaloo: "Mooooooooom" [lyaloo shouting and crying]

Slide 19: [Iyaloo watching TV with the headlines] [a 46-year-old lady was arrested today after she was

found with 5kg bag of Pangolin scales. The Police is yet to determine the value of the scales. She was denied

bail in the Katutura Magistrate court today, the case has been postponed to 30 November to allow further

police investigations]

Slide 20: [Iyaloo crying] and thinking [why does my mom had to do this? She should have continued working

at the supermarket, we would have been a happy family, now she has to be jailed and get fined a huge sum

of money...I need to go talk to my brother about this and educate him so that he won't end up in the same

situation as my mom.

ENDING NOTES:

All illegal activities committed against wildlife should be reported immediately to law enforcement

officers.

Let us educate our community members on the importance and benefits of wildlife conservation.

Schools should educate learners on the importance of wildlife conservation and the sustainable goals

of development.

The school curriculum should sufficiently cover the aspect of law towards environmental

conservation.

Community members should be sensitized on how to co-exist with wildlife.

Strict laws should be enforced to offenders who poach the wildlife.

The private sector should avail funds towards initiatives that are protecting and conserving our

wildlife.
