SO IS DIT dat ek, kragtens die bevoegdheid my verleen, die Wetgewende Vergadering by hierdie Proklamasie oproep om op die sewe-en-twintigste dag van September 1950, byeen te kom en verklaar ek hierby dat die Eerste Sitting van die Eerste Sessie van die Sesde Wetgewende Vergadering gehou sal word te Windhoek om elf uur in die voormiddag op die genoemde sewe-en-twintigste dag van September 1950, vir die afhandeling van sake.

PROCLAMATION
BY HIS HONOUR PETRUS IMKER HOOGENHOUT,
ADMINISTRATOR OF SOUTH WEST AFRICA.

No. 43 of 1950.]

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section *nineteen* of the South West Africa Constitution Act, 1925, of the Parliament of the Union of South Africa, it is provided that the First Sitting of any Session of the Legislative Assembly for the Territory of South West Africa, shall take place on such date as the Administrator may fix by proclamation;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the Legislative Assembly should be summoned to meet;

NOW, THEREFORE, under and by virtue of the power and authority in me vested, I do by this Proclamation summon the Legislative Assembly to meet on the twenty-seventh day of September, 1950, and I hereby declare that the First Sitting of the First Session of the Sixth Legislative Assembly shall be held at Windhoek at eleven o'clock in the forenoon on the said twenty-seventh day of September, 1950, for the dispatch of business.
