**PROMULGATION OF ACT
OF PARLIAMENT**

The following Act which has been passed by the Parliament and signed by the President in terms of the Namibian Constitution is hereby published in terms of Article 56 of that Constitution.

ACT

To amend the Judges' Remuneration Act, 1990, so as to increase the non-taxable allowance and the salary payable to judges; and to provide for incidental matters.

(Signed by the President on 27 October 1994)

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of the Republic of Namibia, as follows:-

Amendment of section 2
of Act 18 of 1990.

1. Section 2 of the Judges' Remuneration Act, 1990 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), is hereby amended by the substitution for subsection (1) of the following subsection:

“(1) Any person who holds office as a judge, whether in an acting or *ad hoc* or permanent capacity, shall in respect thereof [**in addition to**] be paid [a] an annual non-taxable allowance [at the rate of R3 000 per annum be paid] and a monthly salary at the [**rate**] rates specified in the second column of the First and Second Schedule, respectively, opposite the designation of the office in which the judge concerned serves.”.

Amendment of section 3
of Act 18 of 1990.

2. Section 3 of the principal Act is hereby amended by the substitution for subsection (1) of the following subsection:

“(1) The President, acting on recommendation of the Judicial Service Commission, may by proclamation in the *Gazette* amend the second column of the [**First**] Second Schedule so as to increase the rates specified therein.”.

Substitution of First
Schedule to Act 18 of
1990.

3. The following schedule is hereby substituted for the First Schedule to the principal Act, the existing First Schedule becoming the Second Schedule and the existing Second Schedule becoming the Third Schedule:

"FIRST SCHEDULE

(Section 2(1))

Designation of Office	Non-taxable allowance per annum
Chief Justice	N\$17 500
Additional judge of the Supreme Court	N\$10 000
<i>Ad hoc</i> judge of the Supreme Court	An allowance at the same rate as that of an additional judge of the Supreme Court, proportionate to the period during which he or she acts as an <i>ad hoc</i> judge
Judge-President	N\$15 000
Additional judge of the High Court	N\$10 000".

Substitution of Second
Schedule to Act 18 of
1990.

4. The following schedule is hereby substituted for the Second Schedule to the principal Act (as renumbered by section 3 of this Act):

"SECOND SCHEDULE

(Section 2(1))

Designation of Office	Salary per annum
Chief Justice	N\$225 000
Additional judge of the Supreme Court	N\$222 000
<i>Ad hoc</i> judge of the Supreme Court	A remuneration at the same rate as that of an additional judge of the Supreme Court,

Judge-President	N\$220 000
Additional judge of <u>the High Court</u>	N\$212 000".

Repeal of Proclamation
12 of 1994.

5. Proclamation 12 of 1994 is hereby repealed.

Short title and com-
mencement.

6. This Act shall be called the Judges' Remuneration Amendment Act, 1994, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1 April 1994.
