SCHEDULE

1. Name of township

The township is called Katima Mulilo (Extension 9).

2. Composition of township

The township comprises 215 erven numbered 2401 to 2615 and 2616 to 2618, public open spaces and streets as indicated on General Plan B188 (SG A481/2001).

3. Reservation of erven

The following erven are reserved for the Local Authority:

erven 2616 to 2618 for public open space purposes;

4. Conditions of title

(1) The following conditions are registered in favour of the Local Authority against the title deeds of all erven except the erven referred to in paragraph 3:

- (a) There shall be no obstruction or deviation of any natural course of storm water over the erf without the written approval of the Local Authority.
- (b) The erf is subject to the reservation for the Local Authority of the right of access and use without compensation of the area three metres parallel with any boundary of such erf, for the construction and maintenance of municipal services in respect of water, sewerage, drainage, electricity and gas, which right includes the right to place on such erf temporarily any material that may be excavated during such operations on the erf or any adjacent erf.
- (c) If the erf has more than one street frontage, access to the erf shall be obtained from the street determined by the Local Authority.
- (d) No offensive trade shall be established or conducted on the erf -

For the purposes of this item, "offensive trade" means any of the businesses, trades, works or institutions mentioned in regulation 1(a) of the regulations promulgated under Government Notice No. 141 of 10 November 1926.
- (e) No cattle, pigs, goats, sheep, monkeys, beast of prey or draught-animals shall be kept or allowed on the erf.

(2) The following conditions shall in addition to those enumerated in paragraph 4(1), be registered in favour of the Local Authority Council against the title deeds of erven 2401 to 2473, 2475 to 2506, 2508 to 2615:

- “(a) The erf shall only be used for residential purposes.
- (b) The building value of the main building, including the outbuildings, to be erected on the erf shall be at least two times the valuation of the erf”.

- (3) The following conditions shall, in addition to those enumerated in paragraph 4(1), be registered in favour of the Local Authority Council against the title deeds of erven 2474 and 2507:
- (a) The erf may be used only for religious and institutional purposes and for purposes incidental thereto.
 - (b) The building value of the main building, including the outbuildings to be erected on the erf shall be at least two times the valuation of the erf.

For the purposes of this item “institutional purposes” means uses including schools, places of instruction, churches, community halls, crèches, hospitals, clinics, community projects or similar uses.

Definitions

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates “Regulations” means the Road Traffic and Transport Regulations, 2001 promulgated under Government Notice No. 53 of 2001, as amended by Government Notice No. 97 of 2001.

Insertion of regulation 383

2. The following regulation is inserted after regulation 383 of the regulations:

“Interim Procedure for the exchange of a driving licence contained in South African identity document

383A.(1) Notwithstanding regulation 383, an application for the exchange of a driving licence issued in Namibia in terms of the repealed Ordinance of which a Namibian citizen or a person who is permanently resident in Namibia is the holder and which is contained in an identity document issued by the South African Government in accordance with the laws of that country, may, from the date determined by the Minister in terms of section 40 of the Act, be made to any driving testing center on the approved form.

(2) An application for the exchange of a driving licence referred to in sub-regulation (1) must be accompanied by -

- (i) the original driving licence as contained in that identity document;
- (ii) the acceptable identification of the applicant;
- (iii) the fee prescribed for the issue of a driving licence in terms of Schedule 1 of the Regulations.

(3) If the driving testing center is satisfied with regard to the identity of the holder of the driving licence concerned, it must issue to the applicant a driving licence of the corresponding code contemplated in Schedule 4 to these Regulations.”.

Amendment of Schedule 4

3. Schedule 4 to the Regulations is amended by the substitution for the expression “50cm³” wherever it appears in paragraphs 3 and 6, of the expression “125 cm³”.

AMENDMENT OF WATER SUPPLY REGULATIONS

The Council of the Municipality of Windhoek, under section 30(1)(u) of the Local Authorities Act, 1992 (Act No. 23 of 1992) amends the fees, charges and other monies payable in respect of the supply of water and other services in the Water Supply Regulations, promulgated under Government Notice 363 of 1996, as set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Annexure A to the Water Supply Regulations is hereby amended:

- 1 By the substitution for paragraph 1 with the following paragraph 1:

“1. BASIC CHARGE:

Each consumer shall pay, in addition to any other tariff payable in terms of any other paragraph of this Annexure, the following basic charge to the Council whether water was consumed or not, determined according to the diameter of the meter inlet:

15 mm	N\$11.07
20 mm	N\$26.49
25 mm	N\$43.11
40 mm	N\$282.55
50 mm	N\$497.52

- 2 By the substitution for subparagraph (1) of paragraph 2 with the following:

“2. TARIFF BASED ON CONSUMPTION:

(1) For water supplied in addition to the basic charge referred to in paragraph 1 -

(a) in the case of a consumer to whom water is supplied for domestic purposes -

(i) where the volume of water supplied during the period for which the meter reading was carried out amounts to an average daily consumption not exceeding 0,200 kilolitre, for each kilolitre of water supplied: N\$3.97

(ii) plus, where the volume of water supplied during such period amounts to an average daily consumption in excess of 0,200 kilolitre, but not exceeding 1,50 kilolitre per day on average, for each kilolitre of water supplied in excess of an average daily consumption of 0.200 kilolitre: N\$6.61

OR

(ii) in times of short supply plus, where the volume of water supplied during such period amounts to an average daily consumption in excess of 0,200 kilolitre, but not exceeding 1,2 kilolitre per day on average, for each kilolitre of water supplied in excess of an average daily consumption of 0.200 kilolitre: N\$6.61

(iii) plus, for each kilolitre water supplied in excess of the volume calculated in accordance with subparagraph (ii) per kilolitre: N\$12.17

(b) in the case of a consumer other than one in respect of which special agreement had been entered into in terms of regulation 68 or a consumer referred to in paragraph (a), for each kilolitre of water supplied: N\$7.02
