The meter and reconnection without charges

The circuit breaker shall be deemed to be correct if it carries the full rated current for an uninterrupted period of one hour without tripping.

6. TESTING OF METERS

If not satisfied with the meter reading and wanted it to be tested the following procedure shall apply:

Apply in writing to the Council within ten days of the last day of the month during which the reading in question was taken, and the meter shall be tested on payment of a deposit of N\$444.44 calculated as follows:

If the meter is correct, the deposit shall be forfeited.

If the meter is proved incorrect, the Council shall refund the deposit, repair the meter and reconnect without charges.

The meter shall be considered to be registering correct if the error is not more than 2.5% either way.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO PARKS AND RECREATIONAL AREAS: LOCAL AUTHORITIES ACT, 1992

The Town Council of Katima Mulilo, after consultation with the Minister of Regional and Local Government and Housing, under section 94(1) of the Local Authorities Act, 1992 (Act No. 23 of 1992), has made the regulations set out in the Schedule.

BY ORDER OF THE COUNCIL**M.S. MUDABETI
CHAIRPERSON OF THE COUNCIL****SCHEDULE****Definitions**

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, any word or expression defined in the Act has that meaning, and -

“authorized officer” means any officer in the service of the Council who is authorized by the Council to administer any of these regulations;

“Council” means the Town Council of Katima Mulilo;

“park” means a park, garden square or an open-space established by the Council for public use;

“recreational area” means a recreational area established by the Council for public use; and

“the Act” means the Local Authorities Act, 1992 (Act No. 23 of 1992).

Access to park and recreational area

2. (1) A person may not enter or remain in a park or recreational area during any period which such park or recreational area is closed to the public by means of a notice displayed by the Council at every access gate thereof.

(2) A person may not enter a park or recreational area by climbing over or through any fence or edge or over any wall, or in any other manner than through an access gate.

Pollution

3. A person may not in a park or recreational area -
- (a) at any place, throw away, discard or leave any refuse or rubbish, except in a refuse bin, provided by the Council for that purposes;
 - (b) pollute drinking water in any manner whatsoever or tamper with or damage any water installations; or
 - (c) pollute the water of any dam, fish pond, river or other expanse of water by throwing soap, oil, rubbish, refuse or any offensive object, material or liquid into such water, or causing or allowing it to fall or flow into such water;
 - (d) wash any animal, clothes or other object in the water of a dam, fish pond, river or other expanse of water; or
 - (e) affix to any object or leave behind in any place any notice, pamphlet, hand bill or any other printed or written documents.

Damaging, destruction and disfigurement

4. A person may not in a park or recreational area -

- (a) take out, gather, disfigure, damage or destroy or tamper with any tree, plant, shrub, flower, fruit or any other object of zoological, geological, archeological, historical or other scientific interest;
- (b) walk, run or ride in or on any flower bed or lawn which may be damaged thereby, or in any other manner damage it;
- (c) disfigure, damage or destroy or tamper with any property of the Council;
- (d) remove or concern himself or herself with, any sand, gravel stone, sods, soil or other substances; or
- (e) gather firewood.

Animal, birds and fishes

5. A person may not in a park or recreational area, except with prior written permission of the Council -

- (a) capture, pursue, kill, injure or unnecessarily disturb any wild animal, bird or fish, or damage destroy or disturb a nest of any bird; or
- (b) use or set any trap, net or other device or instrument with which any animal, bird or fish may be caught, injured or killed.

Sanitary convenience

6. A person may not in a park or recreational area -

- (a) relieve nature except in a sanitary convenience provided for that purpose; or
- (b) enter, invade or use any sanitary conveniences set apart for members of opposite sex by means of a notice or symbol affixed at a visible position.

Fire

7. A person may not in a park or recreational area -

- (a) set fire to any object or throw away or leave behind any burning or smoldering object in a place where it may light a fire for another object; or
- (b) make fire in any place other than a fireplace provided by the Council, but, if there is no fireplace provided in a recreational area, a fire may be made in a place where no danger exists of such fire setting fire to another object.

Orderliness and decency

8. A person may not in a park or recreational area -

- (a) be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs having a narcotic effect;
- (b) gamble;
- (c) beg;
- (d) lie on any seat;
- (e) behave himself or herself in an indecent, unseemly, offensive or insulting manner or in any manner which may expose another person to danger;

- (f) by making or causing a noise or in any other manner cause annoyance, nuisance, obstruction or hindrance, or disturb the comfort and convenience of another person;
- (g) use indecent, unseemly or insulting language; or
- (h) be indecently clothed.

Public meetings, trading, printed matter and collection of money

9. A person may not in a park or recreational area without the prior written permission of the Council -

- (a) organize, present or participate in any orchestral recital or any other public entertainment;
- (b) organise, present or participate in any sermon, lecture or any other public meeting or gathering;
- (c) trade in any article or material, take orders therefore, offer it for hire or carry any occupation;
- (d) distribute any book, pamphlet, handbill or any other printed or written matters; or
- (e) collect money from the public.

Playing apparatus and games

10. (1) A person may not wilfully or negligently use any swing or other playing apparatus in a park recreational area in such a manner that it may injure any person or damage any property.

(2) A person over the age of 16 years may not use any swing or other playing apparatus.

(3) A person must, on request of any authorized officer, vacate any swing or other playing apparatus.

Dogs

11. (1) A person may not bring a dog into a park or recreational area contrary to a notice of the Council which prohibits the entry of dogs, displayed in a visible position at an access gate.

(2) A person may not in a park or recreational area instigate or allow any dog to attack, chase or disturb any person, animal or bird.

(3) Where dogs are allowed to enter a park or recreational area the person having control or supervision of a dog that enters such park or recreational area must at all time keep such dog under proper control by means of a leash.

(4) A person may not allow a dog of which he or she is the owner or which is under his or her control or supervision, to enter any dam, fish pond, river or other expanse of water in a park or recreational area.

Powers of officers

12. (1) Any authorised officer may at any time request any person who in his or her opinion, contravenes any provision of these regulations to -

- (a) leave the park or recreational area concerned; or
- (b) furnish his or her correct name and address

(2) Any person to whom a request is made in terms of subregulation (1), must forthwith comply with such request.

Risk

13. Any person entering a park or recreational area does so at his or her own risk and the Council is not liable in respect of any damage, loss or injury incurred by such person.

Miscellaneous

- 14.** A person may not in a park or recreational area -
- (a) shoot with a bow and arrow, catapult, air gun or fire-arm;
 - (b) roll or throw stones or rocks from any mountain or rise;
 - (c) swim or bath in any dam, fish pond, river or other expanse of water;
 - (d) without the prior permission of the Council, camp or erect any structure;
 - (e) climb over or through any fence or hedge or over any wall; or
 - (f) enter any way where entry is prohibited by means of a notice of the Council displayed in a visible position, unless such person has obtained the prior permission of the Council.

Offences and penalties

15. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these regulations commits an offence and is liable to a fine not exceeding N\$2 000 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or to both such fine and such imprisonment.
