



TRAVELING BACK TO NAMIBIA

All non-Namibian travelers (except for children under the age of 5 years) arriving in Namibia have to present a negative COVID-19 PCR test result from the country of departure, which is not older than 72 hours.

Returning Namibian citizens or holders of permanent Namibian residence or employment permits may enter the country without a COVID-19 PCR test result or with a positive result. But in cases of arrival without a COVID-19 test result, s/he will be swabbed immediately upon arrival while observing guarantine and if the result comes out negative, they will be released from guarantine. If the result is positive, he/she will have to stay in isolation.
