REGULATIONS MADE IN TERMS OF
**Agricultural Produce Export
Ordinance 13 of 1928**
section 6

**Regulations governing Inspection
of Livestock and Meat Exported**

Government Notice 18 of 1929

(OG 309)

came into force on 1 April 1929 (GN 18/1929)

The Government Notice which publishes these regulations notes that they apply to “the inspection of cattle, sheep, goats or pigs and the meat or other edible portions derived from any of those animals declared by Proclamation No. 5 dated the 23rd day of January, 1929, to be agricultural produce for the purposes of the said Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder”.

ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

SCHEDULE

Form of Application for Examination of Animals or Carcasses

1. Any person, society or company desiring to export cattle, sheep, goats or pigs or the meat or other edible portions derived from any of those animals, shall make application for the examination thereof in the form shown in the schedule hereto.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or pigs, or the carcasses of any of such animals, intended for export, shall be inspected by an inspector at such places as may be approved by the Administrator; and animals the meat of which is intended for export shall be slaughtered only after the permission of the said inspector has been given, and the said inspector shall not give

such permission unless satisfied that such animals are in good condition and free from all symptoms of disease.

3. Immediately after the slaughter of any animal mentioned in regulation *one* the meat of which it is intended to export, the carcass and organs thereof shall be examined by an inspector, and no person shall export the meat or other edible portions of any such animal unless such meat or edible portions bear a label on which is endorsed a certificate by the inspector, in the following terms -

The label mentioned in this regulation may subsequently be removed by the inspector if, in his opinion, the condition of the meat is such that it is unlikely that it will be brought to its destination in a sound or good marketable state.

4. No meat of any of the animals referred to in regulation *one* shall be received aboard a vessel for export unless accompanied by a certificate in the following form -

5. No live cattle, sheep, goats or pigs, shall be exported unless they have been inspected and passed by an inspector as fit for export, and free from any symptoms of infectious and contagious disease.

6. No live cattle, sheep, goats or pigs, shall be received aboard a vessel for export unless accompanied by a certificate following forms: -

7. The following fees for inspection shall be paid to the inspecting officer.

Inspection of cattle (including calves)	
for export as live cattle	1/- per animal.
Inspection of sheep, goats and pigs for	
export as live sheep, goats or pigs	3d per animal.
Inspection of cattle (including calves)	
about to be slaughtered and the carcasses thereof	8d per animal.
Inspection of sheep, goats or pigs	
about to be slaughtered and the carcasses thereof	3d per animal.

In any case in which the inspection is carried out by an officer employed and paid by a local authority, such authority shall receive the fees payable.
