# Livestock and Livestock Products Act 12 of 1981 section 24

# Regulations made under the Meat Industry Act, 1981 (Act 12 of 1981)

The Meat Industry Act 12 of 1981 was subsequently re-named the Livestock and Livestock Products Act 12 of 1981 (<u>GG 8182</u>).

## **ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS**

- 1. Appeal against decision of board
- 2. Payment of levies

[GN 110/1992 and GN 126/1992 both substitute "Minister" for "Council of Ministers" throughout the regulations.]

#### Appeal against decision of board

**1.** (1) Whenever any person appeals to the Minister against any decision of the board, he shall within ninety days after the board has advised him of the decision, lodge with the Minister a written notice of appeal and forward a copy thereof by registered post to the board.

(2) Within fourteen days after receipt of the said copy the board shall furnish written reasons for its decision to the Minister and by registered post to the appellant.

(3) If the appellant decides to proceed with his appeal, he shall, within twenty-one days after receipt of the said reasons, furnish his grounds of appeal to the Minister which shall proceed in accordance with the provisions of section 11 of the Meat Industry Act, 1981.

(4) If the Minister is satisfied that the provisions of subregulation (2) have not been complied with, it shall proceed as if the board has acquiesced in the setting aside of its decision.

#### **Payment of levies**

2. (1) The levy imposed under section 17(1) of the Act must be paid to the board by the fifteenth day of the month following the month in which the cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, meat or meat product concerned were sold, imported, exported or slaughtered.

(2) every payment of a levy referred to in subregulation (1) must be accompanied by a statement indicating -

#### [The word "Every" at the beginning of the introductory phrase should be capitalised.]

- (a) particulars of cattle, sheep, goats or pigs sold in Namibia;
- (b) particulars of cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, meat or meat products imported into Namibia;
- (c) particulars of cattle, sheep, goats or pigs exported from Namibia;
- (d) particulars of cattle, sheep, goat or pigs slaughtered in Namibia;

#### [The word "goat" should be "goats".]

(e) the value of each unit of cattle, sheep, goats or pigs and the value of each category of meat or meat product units in question.

(3) In the event of livestock being slaughtered at an abattoir, the abattoir owner shall not later than the fifteenth of each calendar month -

- (a) on behalf of a person liable in terms of subregulation (1) to pay any levy referred to in that subregulation, pay to the board the levy in question; and
- (b) furnish the board with a statement showing the total number of livestock slaughtered at that abattoir during the preceding month.

(4) Any person who pays in terms of these regulations any levy to the board for any livestock of which he or she is not the owner may recover the amount of such levy from the person slaughtering the livestock in question.

(5) A person who pays a levy on behalf of another person must be paid by the board, a commission equal to 3% of such levy.
