Black Reserves (South West Africa) Act 44 of 1945 (SA)

SA GG 3514

came into force on date of publication: 22 June 1945; originally entitled the "Native Reserves (South West Africa) Act"

APPLICABILITY TO SOUTH WEST AFRICA: This Act applies to South West Africa by virtue of its subject matter.

TRANSFER TO SOUTH WEST AFRICA: No Minister is mentioned in the Act. In any event, there were no amendments to the Act in South Africa.

ACT

To authorize a certain transaction affecting land reserved for native occupation.

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

- 1. Authorization of transaction affecting certain land reserved for native occupation.
- 2. Short title

BE IT ENACTED by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Union of South Africa, as follows: -

Black Reserves (South West Africa) Act 44 of 1945 (SA)

[References to "native" and "natives" in South African laws were changed to "Bantu" by Act 42 of 1964 and then to "Black" or "Blacks" by Act 102 of 1978.]

Authorization of transaction affecting certain land reserved for native occupation

- 1. (1) Authority is hereby granted for the disestablishment of the Black reserve known as the Aukeigas Black Reserve, set aside by the Administrator of the Mandated Territory of South West Africa by Government Notice No. 77 dated the twelfth day of April 1932, and situated in the district of Windhoek in the said Territory, subject to the setting aside, as a native reserve in lieu thereof, of a certain area of land approximately 60,000 hectares in extent, belonging to the Administration of the said Territory and adjoining the Okombahe Black reserve and the Otjohorongo Black reserve in the district of Omaruru.
- (2) The Administrator of the said Territory and every other person who may be concerned in the transaction authorized by sub-section (1) may do all such acts as give effect thereto.

Short title

2. This Act shall be called the Black Reserves (South West Africa) Act, 1945.
